

Dear Praying Supporters and Friends:

Another trip to Honduras successfully completed, however it started with a major headache. Flying just seems to be getting more problematic the more I travel and guess it shouldn't be surprising. A delay out of Bentonville caused a lost connection out of Houston, but as we were getting reassigned onto a different flight, our original flight was being returned to the gate because of mechanical problems. We were able to board, but on arriving in San Pedro Sula our luggage hadn't come with us. That luggage contained not only personal stuff but also much needed meds and supplies for our 9 days.

Long story short, none of the contact numbers given me worked or were answered and it was 5 days before our luggage arrived. Talk about a welcome sight! The four of us were all starting to reek and ready to have a bon fire to burn our underwear. In spite of this handicap, both my team of 6 and Victor's team of 5 worked in two villages. The clinics were set up in churches Victor had started and what a busy time! This was the first time the crowds of sick and hurting were so large the pastors and our 2 evangelists held regular meetings as we could only see a few at a time. What an encouragement to these struggling pastors. These communities are strong Catholics and NOT open to the gospel, but here they came because of physical needs and what a captive audience! Many decisions were made and the pastors have their work cut out on following up, but what a thrill for them!!

This was also the first time a 13 and 17 year old came as part of my team, but there were jobs for them. They learned the names of instruments so they could hand them to me and also to keep them clean. Half way through our caravan, because of miscommunication, we ran out of dental supplies but were able to get enough material to get us through the next two days.

We also found out there is a HUGE need for reading glasses, something I just started bringing. One church donated both used, bifocals and trifocals, and new readers and they were gone in 30 minutes! One donator said she had gotten dozens of them at the Dollar Store. If any of you could give a shout out to your congregations, that would be so greatly appreciated!! I really praise the Lord that my shoulder worked well enough to be able to pull 268 teeth. What a privilege to meet these poor people's dental and medical needs.

A soccer team spent the night at the hotel we were staying in because of a championship game the next day. The next morning after breakfast I saw the 29 man team in the street doing exercises. I went up to the coach and asked him if he would like a million dollar bill. It's a gospel track with a message on the back, and he thought it was pretty cool. Then another guy came over and asked if he could have one. Well, the word got out and the team about attacked me to get their million dollar bill. I told them that there was some good news on the back. As they were leaving the next morning, I asked how their game went and they said they won. Many thanked me for that great "million dollars" stating they enjoyed the message on the back. God promised His Word will not return void and I just pray that the planted Word will work in their hearts. If you think about it, pray for these guys!!

Besides our delayed luggage, the biggest "thorn in my flesh" was my two knees. The pain has been getting worse and hampering my mobility. I'd appreciate your prayers as I see a

chiropractor to see if he can help. My next trip is to Ecuador in July and I am trusting God to heal my knees before this trip.
