You have heard

the phrase, "Oh, he or she marches to a different

drummer." Sometimes we say, "He/she waltzes to a different tune." When somebody is different

from the usual, we use such language to describe their way of being. This November / means the person hears a special, even other-October worldly source of inspiration. Now, near the end of the calendar year, let's think about how Jesus-followers intentionally live a life that sounds forth the rhythm of Christ - the divine heartbeat - the music of the heavenly band. We do dance to a different tune – march to a different beat.

The Christian year begins with Advent, the Season leading up to Christmas, when we celebrate Jesus' birth into the world. We are remembering and bringing to our fellow human beings the "Good News of Great Joy." Over the centuries people of faith have changed culture everywhere by

making a big wonderful deal of the miracle of a virgin girl bearing a heavenly child, Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The first Sunday of Advent is day one of the Jesusfollower's year.

July The Feast of Christmas is followed by Epiphany (when the wise men visited the Holy Child), the Baptism of the Lord (when John Baptist baptized Jesus) and the Season of Ordinary Time (when the Lord Jesus was present in

the world). In the spring, Christians turn their hearts and minds to Jesus' journey to Jerusalem to offer Himself as a sacrifice for all peoples and all of creation. We keep the Season of Lent until the great Feast of Easter – the glorious day of Christ's resurrection from death to New Life. We celebrate the Feast of the Ascension (Jesus' return to His heavenly home) and almost immediately we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost (when the Holy Spirit entered the world to guide the people of God).

The world barely notices the great wonder of the coming of the blessed Holy Spirit into their lives (celebrated in May or June). Jesus-followers stay mindful of that universeshaking event by keeping the Season after Pentecost for about half the calendar year. For us, at this moment (November and December) the Season after Pentecost is coming to an end. We dress the altar and the other furnishings of the church in green during this time, to symbolize the promise of eternal life given to us in Jesus by the sacrifice He made for us.

Here we are, just four weeks away from the Feast of Christ the King (the last day of the Christian Year). December 1st we will begin the Season of Advent – in joyful anticipation of Christmas Day, the celebration of our Savior Jesus Christ's birth. We tune our lives to the rhythm of Christ every day of the year. This is our way of celebrating the Good News of the Lord Jesus at all times.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD



SENDING GOOD NEWS AND GREAT JOY TO PARAGUAY AND SURINAME

Four-year-old Jonathon came to an Operation Christmas Child outreach event in Paraguay along with his two brothers. Their father had abandoned them and the boys had few resources. Jonathon arrived barefoot, but a ministry partner said, "The excitement this child had to simply hear the Word of God was indescribable."

After listening to the Gospel message, Jonathon opened his shoebox gift to find a beautiful pair of shoes. When a volunteer asked him if he liked his items, he hugged her and said with tears in his eyes, "God is good." Jonathon put on his new shoes and a big smile came across his face!

Individual stories like Jonathon's are happening all over the world through Operation Christmas Child. More than 1,800 miles to the north of Paraguay in the nation of Suriname, churches are working together to minister to the indigenous people in the area. The congregations hosted an outreach event to share the Gospel and distribute shoebox gifts to nearly 500 children. Of this group, more than 175 children also participated in The Greatest Journey, our follow-up discipleship course. Nearly all of these boys and girls completed the 12 lessons of the program, learning how to faithfully follow Christ and share Him with others.

In 1998 Anna Shimer, a former Pastor's daughter, introduced our church to Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child shoebox program and the people of this church started packing shoeboxes. In 2007 our church became a drop-off location for receiving shoeboxes throughout Western Washington County. As an individual church early on and with the boxes received from our neighbors, we have seen over 12,000 shoeboxes come through this church. For over 20 years we have been sending hope and joy in the way of simple gifts in shoeboxes to children who might not otherwise have any hope or joy. Just as Jonathan received a shoebox, over 12,000 children have received shoeboxes from the people of this church and our neighbors.

We are now in the season of packing shoeboxes for this year and we hope that
